**Fort Worth, TX** – An engineering feat worth seeing, *Big Hubless* roars into the Fort Worth Museum of Science and History on November 15, 2013. The motorcycle, *Big Hubless*, was fabricated completely from scratch using scrap yard finds and has a rear wheel without a hub or axle that sits on an industrial machine bearing.

Bryan Stalcup, inventor and creator of *Big Hubless*, from a young age always strove to try new things and re-imagine engineering creations. This motorcycle, which won the 2010 Sturgis Motorcycle Rally Garage Shop Fabricator Contest, is proof of what you can accomplish when you commit your mind to seeing the way the world works in different ways. In order to encourage and inspire guests, *Big Hubless* will be placed in the center of our Innovation Studio Galleries.
