L’Heureux to Antarctica and discover the majestic beauty of a variety of penguins through this spectacular photograph exhibit starting November 15, 2013 at the Fort Worth Museum of Science and History. This new exhibit, *Penguins*, captures the enchantment of these magnificent species that first caught L’Heureux’s eyes and heart.

On her first expedition to Antarctica, Ms. L’Heureux was overjoyed by the sheer variety of forms, colors and types of ice, all of which she photographed extensively. On this first trip she was introduced to four species of penguin: Adélie, Gentoo, Macaroni, and Chinstrap, all of which inhabit the Antarctic Peninsula.
